At the height of China's worst Covid outbreak, the authorities in Shanghai took over gleaming high-rise office buildings and turned them into mass vaccination centers. First, after hours, then after noon, the buildings were filled with people, their hair arranged in tight rows.

Those buildings, and the broader lockdown of Shanghai, reinforced the ruling Chinese Communist Party's power in a crucial moment: its response to a variant Covid. But they also fostered deep frustration with the government's tactics and overreach.

Police officers in Seoul, South Korea, failed to notice a fire in a narrow alleyway that was quickly spreading, leading to a deadly fire that killed at least 17 people.



For nearly four hours before people started dying during a Halloween celebration in Seoul's Hwaro district, police were planning with police to direct the crowds that were packing World Food Street and pushing into a 10-foot-wide alley — a tight, sloping space where most of the fire would be lost in a gruesome crash.

And once that crash began, it took at least 20 minutes for emergency personnel to start clearing the area, trapping people. Some victims were trapped for more than an hour before rescuers reached them. The delay proved catastrophic.
